We value aloha,

And we demonstrate this by acknowledging that aloha is unique to Hawai'i. IT IS FROM THIS PLACE. By valuing aloha, we value the vast and unique genius of the people of Hawai'i and we prioritize the knowledge, skills, and solutions of its people, recognizing that **ALOHA IS AN ACTION** modeled to us by our environment, and WE VALIDATE ITS ALOHA THROUGH ALOHA 'ĀINA, and our willingness to suffer a little so that no one has to suffer a lot.

We value 'auamo kuleana,

And we demonstrate this by a commitment to empowerment rooted in our belief that everyone has skills and abilities but need circumstances and opportunities to express them, promoting language that recognizes a person's abilities, and SHARED OWNERSHIP AND **ACCOUNTABILITY** if any one of us stumbles, we all fall because WE ARE ALL CONNECTED.

We value flexibility and learning that

Leads to transformation and we demonstrate this by being honest without shame, when we don't know, being courageous, adaptive leaders, even when it calls for difficult conversations and even when our outcomes look like failure, DEMONSTRATING AHONUI AND HA'AHA'A, as we hold tension to achieve change, and PRACTICING MAKAWALU and acknowledging that we each hold one piece that is a part of something bigger.

 - Catalysts, Partners (define roles, kuleana)
 - Performance Measures (indicators of success, milestones)
- Vital Projects (action on these will benefit all strategic goals and priority sectors)
